opinions about almost everything. When things are just about to collapse, they wake up one morning and find they have switched personas. Will seeing things from the other side make matters even worse, or is this just what they need to save their family? ## The Herbal Bed



The second of our staged play readings of the year is set to take place at the Theatre on **Friday, March 8 and Saturday March 9 at 7:30 pm**. This brilliant play by Peter Whelan was written for the Royal Shakespeare Company of Stratford on Avon, London. A modern play, it is a taut, emotional thriller built upon a historical event. Susannah Hall, the daughter of William Shakespeare and the wife of a prominent doctor, is accused of an illicit affair with a local haberdasher. She charges the accuser with slander and the case is heard in the church cathedral in a manner reminiscent of the inquisition. The complex motives of the characters torn between their passions, the truth and their sense of integrity keeps the audience members on the edge of their seats. *Would God ever want me to lie?* 

Staged readings are public performances in which the actors, after a few rehearsals, read the play from the stage without set or props and with minimal movement. It is an opportunity to appreciate the story, language and characterization of a fine script.

The Herbal Bed is directed by Kim MacMillan. The cost for this event is \$5 at the door.

The Theatre Building Committee is still working at securing a site for the new theatre, the latest possible location being near the Salmar Grand. The Salmar Association has formed a committee to look into how they can help us achieve our goals. We expect to be meeting with them in the near future to coordinate plans.

In April we will be meeting with a representative of the Wood Construction Industry to learn how we can utilize local timber in the structural design of the new theatre. Our mandate is to keep as much of the construction as possible locally produced and to create an environmentally friendly facility.

We have had meetings with the new members of the city council and they are very supportive of our efforts. At this time we can say both Council and the Salmar have given us the impression that they are pleased to work with us in an attempt to meet our goals. It is our hope that we will be going back to the theatre membership later this year with a workable plan for their approval. Five years of planning and hard work may soon be paying off!
