HEARTBREAK HOUSE is shaping up to be a great comedy. The actors are extremely dedicated to getting it right! The play, originally called THE HOUSE IN THE CLOUDS, was an experiment in Modernism by George Bernard Shaw and so relies on character and interaction. The focus is partly on Ellie Dunn, (Desiree Roy) a visitor in the house of crazy Captain Shotover (Peter Molnar). Ellie has been invited by Hesione Hushabye (Julia Body) who is determined to keep her from being married to Mangan, the CEO of a large company (Randy Brogden). Ellie learns she has fallen in love with Hector Hushabye, (Kenneth Fraser),



her friend's husband, who she thought a romantic adventurer. The visitors keep arriving, the CEO, Ellie's father, Mazzine Dunn (Peter Buxton-Carr), the Captain's daughter - Lady Utterword (Elaine Holmes) and finally the Burglar - Billy Dunn (Thom Wescott). Excitement is created by the attempted robbery and the first bombs of World War I. Aileen Brand, as the old governess, Nurse Guiness, Jade St. Onge as Randall Utterwood and the two sailors, Vitaliy Demens and Shane Gorner round out the cast.

Make sure you tell your friends that we are doing another great comedy; it doesn't help to tell them after!

The Building Committee has been making progress in their effort to secure a location for the construction of our new theatre building. Currently we are talking with the local School District about the possibility of using part of the old J.L. Jackson site.

Your Board Charts New Directions

The members of your Board of Directors have been working steadily and quietly on your behalf to help the company become all that it can be. Here are some of their recent initiatives:

Developing Policy

Policy is not a very exciting topic, but good policy, well communicated, makes any organization run more effectively. It helps for everyone to know what their job is, what they are trying to achieve and who is responsible for what. Sometimes a board will develop good policies but if they are buried in the minutes they are soon forgotten and may as well not exist. So we are working on getting both new and existing policies organized, numbered and in a policy manual which will be easily accessible. We will also be posting all of them on our website so you can find them at any time. You might be surprised at how helpful that can be.

Developing Our Volunteers

For the past couple of years we have offered an online questionnaire for those who would like to take a volunteer position with the theatre. Kim MacMillan, our Coordinator of Volunteers, has kept all of that information in a database and made it available to the producers of each show. But it's still not always easy for newcomers to get "in", as it's tempting to go with the old standby's that we know and love. But new blood is important so now Sheila Dunbar is taking on the task of contacting and working with new people to help them get involved, receive mentoring, if necessary, and making them feel welcome. Please do your part to recognize and welcome people you haven't seen before.

New Website

We have received a \$1,000 grant from the Shuswap Community Foundation for the design and development of a new website and a revamped theatre logo to go with it. We expect to have this up and running soon. The new site will give us much greater ability to add and revise content ourselves on an ongoing basis. Did I mention that all our policies will be on there, too?

Communicating with Our Audience

Along with other community theatre groups, we are finding that the traditional ways of communicating with current and potential audience members are not working as well as they once did. So we have been seeking better quality information with an eye to a more interactive approach, especially for younger people, by using the website. During *Wrong for Each Other* we asked audience members to complete a brief questionnaire. We also have begun keeping better records of what kinds of tickets we sell each night (adult, student, comps, etc.). We hope soon to have a functioning email list of audience members so we can keep them informed of what is happing.

Attending Drama Festivals

Shuswap Theatre has long been a member of Theatre BC whose job it is to support and promote community theatre throughout the province. One of the main ways they do that is to offer a Drama Festival in each of the ten zones each year, followed by a provincial festival, called *Mainstage* which features the winning plays from each zone. We are extremely lucky that *Mainstage* is now held each year in Kamloops. Since my retirement and subsequent re-involvement with the theatre, I have noticed that our own members are under-represented at both festivals. So I would like to point out the benefits of festival attendance.



Entertainment: Each company tries hard to send its very best work to festival. So you're likely to be treated to some excellent theatre.

Learning: A prime benefit is that you can learn a great deal about how to do theatre well. The adjudicator offers a *coffee critique*, which is really a short workshop the morning after each performance. It is amazing to watch how a skilled professional can bring out the best in an amateur performer. This learning benefits our entire company by building depth of knowledge. *Mainstage* offers even more workshops, readings, etc. with which to improve your skill and knowledge.

Hanging Out: Attending festivals allows you to rub shoulders with others who have a passion for theatre. Just hanging out during breaks and meals leads to new learnings and developing friendships.

I would encourage our members to go, not just for our own festival show, but to stick around for some or all of the other performances. It will inspire you and it will build our company.
