AN EXCITING SEASON PLANNED

Our Artistic Committee - Julia Body, James Bowlby and Gayle Heinrich - have worked very hard this spring to plan the 2007-08 season. As in the past, there are three mainstage plays, a Second Stage production and again this year, a Christmas pantomime.

The opening production of the season, *Kiss the Moon, Kiss the Sun,* is a Canadian play, written be Norm Foster and directed by Danielle Dunn-Morris. (Read more about it on the next page.)

James Bowlby will again direct a Christmas Pantomime, this time *Aladdin*. This well-known tale is sure to delight children and adults alike. It will run from Dec. 7-9 and 14-16.

Our winter production is entitled *The Attic, the Pearls & Three Fine Girls*. This is another Canadian play, written by Jennifer Brown, Leah Cherniak, Ann-Marie MacDonald, Alisa Palmer and Martha Ross (good luck fitting all those names on the poster!), will be directed by Julia Body and will run from February 22 - March 1. Although billed as a comedy, you will find this play very moving, too.

Gayle Heinrich is the director of our spring production *Dancock's Dance*, written by another Canadian playwright and author, Guy Vanderhaeghe. This, his first foray into his-

torical fiction, takes place in the North Battleford mental asylum during the 1919 flu epidemic. This gripping drama runs from April 25 to May 3.

The Second Stage production is still in the planning stage, but will be cutting edge scripts - two one-acts, directed by new directors.

KISS THE MOON, KISS THE SUN

Danielle Dunn-Morris is delighted to be returning to Shuswap Theatre as director of our Fall production *Kiss the Moon, Kiss the Sun*. This is an emotionally-charged rollercoaster of a play that explores the relationship between a mentally challenged man and a young pregnant woman. As in real life, this play is a constant tug-of-war between humour and tragedy.

Auditions will take place at the Theatre on Wednesday and Thursday, September 5 and 6 at 7 PM. The play requires five actors - a young man between the ages of 30 and 40, a 30ish woman, a man between 25 and 35 to take the part of the brain damaged person, a mother about 50 and a doctor between the ages of 40 and 50.

HELP NEEDED!

Have you noticed that, although we seem to be able to entice new actors to our stage, the crew list on the program often contains the same names, production after production? We desperately need more people to help backstage in all capacities. Your involvement can be as little or as much as you can spare. Only have a night or two to offer? How about helping paint or wallpaper a set, or do a night on Front of House. We urge you to get more information at the Backstage Bash, where you will be able to sign up to help, or contact any of the directors or producers of the plays.

Serving It Right Certificate

A few times a year, we have a bar at the theatre. Each time we need to get a Special Occasion Licence. The person doing this and serving the drinks is required to have the **Serving It Right Certificate**. At the moment, there are very few members who have this certificate, so the honour always falls to one of us! It would be wonderful if a few more members would consider taking the course. It is a fairly simple process which can be done online or on paper. It involves getting the Program Manual at the liquor store or downloading it at http://www.servingitright.com . I found

the information in the program to be very enlightening, facts that every ryone would benefit from knowing. After studying the manual, you then do an open-book test, either online or on paper. The cost for doing this is \$36 if you do it on the web, \$40 if you mail in the test answer sheet. It is useful to have the certificate for other events, too, such as weddings etc. Please contact me if you would like more information.
